➤ Adaptation Programme

AC

To promote the implementation of enhanced action on adaptation in a coherent manner under the Convention (*Decision 1/CP.16, para 20*)

LEG

To advise on the preparation and implementation strategy for national adaptation programmes of action (NAPAs), which would meet the urgent and immediate adaptation needs of the least developed countries (LDCs) (*Terms of reference of the LEG, Annex to Decision 29/CP.7, para 1*)

WIM Excom

To consider, including through workshops and expert meetings, as appropriate, approaches to address loss and damage associated with climate change impacts in developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change (*Decision 1/CP.16, para 26*)

➤ Other Programmes

CGE

- To improve the process of preparation of NCs from non-Annex I Parties (*Decision 8/CP.5*);
- Reconstituted the CGE for three years from 2010-2012, and mandated the Group to develop its work programme (*Decision 5/CP.15*);
- Extended for a term of one year the CGE, including its current membership (*Decision 18/CP.18*);
- Continued the CGE for five years, from 2014-2018 (*Decision 19/CP.19*).
- Extended for eight years, from 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2026 (*Decision- /CP.24*)

TEC

To facilitate the implementation of enhanced action on technology development and transfer so as to support action on mitigation and adaptation in order to achieve full implementation of the Convention (*Decision 1/CP.16, para 117*)

PCCB

To address gaps and needs, both current and emerging, in implementing capacity-building in developing country Parties and further enhancing capacity-building efforts, including with regard to coherence and coordination in capacity-building activities under the Convention (*Decision 1/CP.21, para 71*)

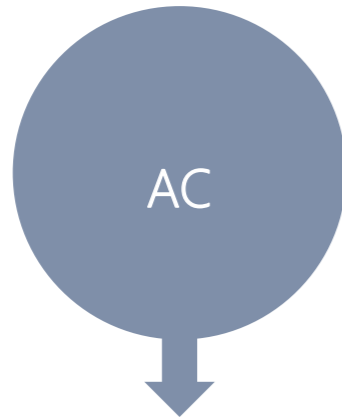
SCF

To assist the COP in exercising its functions with respect to the financial mechanism of the Convention in terms of improving coherence and coordination in the delivery of climate change financing, rationalization of the financial mechanism, mobilization of financial resources and measurement, reporting and verification of support provided to developing country Parties (*Decision 1/CP.16, para 112*)

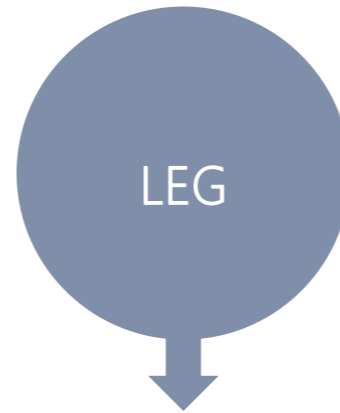


Workplan

➤ Adaptation Programme



- A 3 year-plan for its work, which should include milestones, activities, deliverables and resource requirements for approval by the COP at its eighteenth session (*Decision 2/CP.17, para 97*)



- A work programme that includes implementation of national adaptation programmes of action, for consideration by the SBI at its twenty-fourth session (May 2006) (*Decision 4/CP.11*)

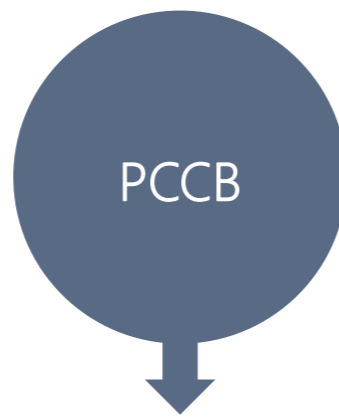

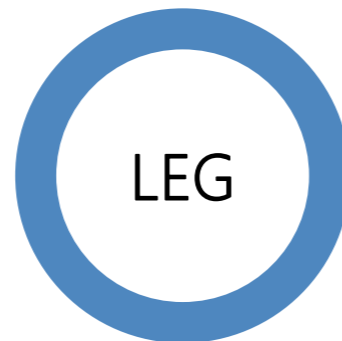
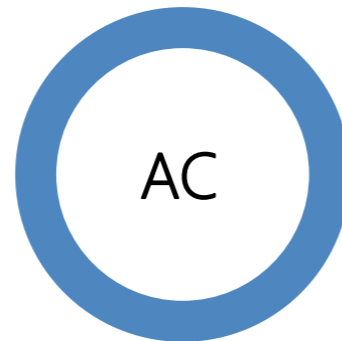
- The SCF extended the two-year workplan on the measurement, reporting and verification of support beyond the biennial assessment (*Decision 7/CP.23, para 7*)



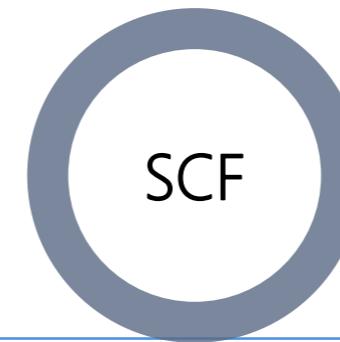
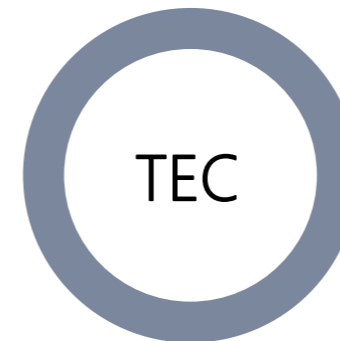
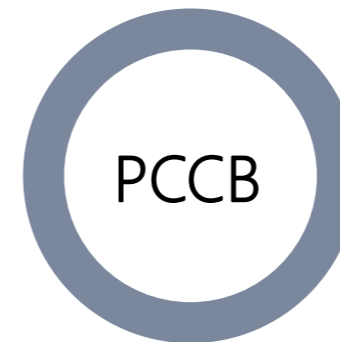

➤ Adaptation Programme

AC

The AC shall report annually to the COP, through the subsidiary bodies, including on its activities, the performance of its functions, guidance, recommendations and other relevant information arising from its work, and, as appropriate, on further action that may be required under the Convention, for consideration by the COP (*Decision 2/CP.17, para 96*)

LEG

Shall report on its work and shall propose a programme of work for the remainder of its term, for consideration at the sixteenth session of the SBI, and shall report on its work to the SBI at its eighteenth and nineteenth sessions (*Decision 29/CP.7, para 8*)

WIM Excom

Report annually to the COP through the SBSTA and the SBI and make recommendations, as appropriate (*Decision 2/CP.19, para 3*)

CGE

Submit a progress report annually on its work to the SBI for its consideration at the sessions of SBI which are held in conjunction with the sessions of the COP (*Decision 19/CP.19, para 7*)

PCCB

Prepare annual technical progress reports on its work, and to make these reports available at the sessions of the SBI coinciding with the sessions of the COP; decides, at its twenty-fifth session, to review the progress of the PCCB and to take any action it considers appropriate (*Decision 1/CP.21, para 80 and 81*)

TEC

The TEC has regularly engaged with the CTCN through participation of the Chairs of both bodies in each other's meetings and through the preparation of joint annual reports to the COP to ensure coherence and synergy within the Technology Mechanism (*Annex II, Rolling workplan of the TEC for 2016-2018, para 19*)

SCF

The Standing Committee shall report and make recommendations to the COP, for its consideration, at each ordinary session of the COP on all aspects of its work (*Decision 2/CP.17, para 120*)



➤ Adaptation Programme

LEG

At least twice a year, in conjunction with other adaptation-related UNFCCC meetings, open to attendance by admitted observer organizations, and shall convene its first meeting soon after the seventeenth session of the COP (*Decision 2/CP.17 para 112, 114, 115*)

AC

Twice each year, the secretariat will organize one meeting in 2002 of the expert group back-to-back with the Consultative Group of Experts on National Communications from Parties not included in Annex I, in order to establish a link on issues relating to adaptation (*Decision 29/CP.7*)

WIM Excom

- Initial meeting of the executive committee by March 2014, the meetings of which will be open to observers (*Decision 2/CP.19 para 8*);
- The Excom shall meet at least twice per year and the meetings of the Excom shall be open to attendance by admitted observer organizations, except where otherwise decided by the Excom (*Decision 2/CP.20 para 12 and 14*)

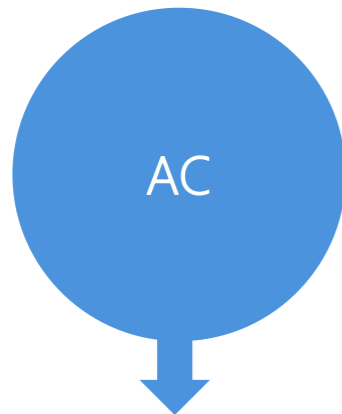

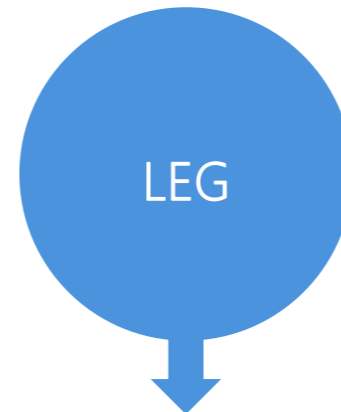
CGE	The consultative group shall meet twice in the year, each time immediately prior to meetings of the subsidiary bodies (<i>Decision 8/CP.5, annex</i>)
PCCB	Meets during annual in-session meetings to be organized by the SBI. The meetings will be open to attendance by Parties and admitted observer organizations (<i>Decision 2/CP.22, annex</i>)
TEC	The TEC shall meet at least twice per year as of 2012, resources permitting. Additional meetings may be organized as necessary to enable it to discharge its responsibilities (<i>Annex II, Rules of procedure of the TEC, para 29</i>)
SCF	The Standing Committee shall meet at least twice a year, or more if necessary, and its first meeting shall take place prior to the thirty-sixth session of the SBI (<i>Decision 2/CP.17, Annex VI, para 7</i>)

- The COP looks forward to receiving information, at its nineteenth session, on progress made in the implementation of the workplan to deliver on its objectives (*Decision 11/CP.18, para 1*)

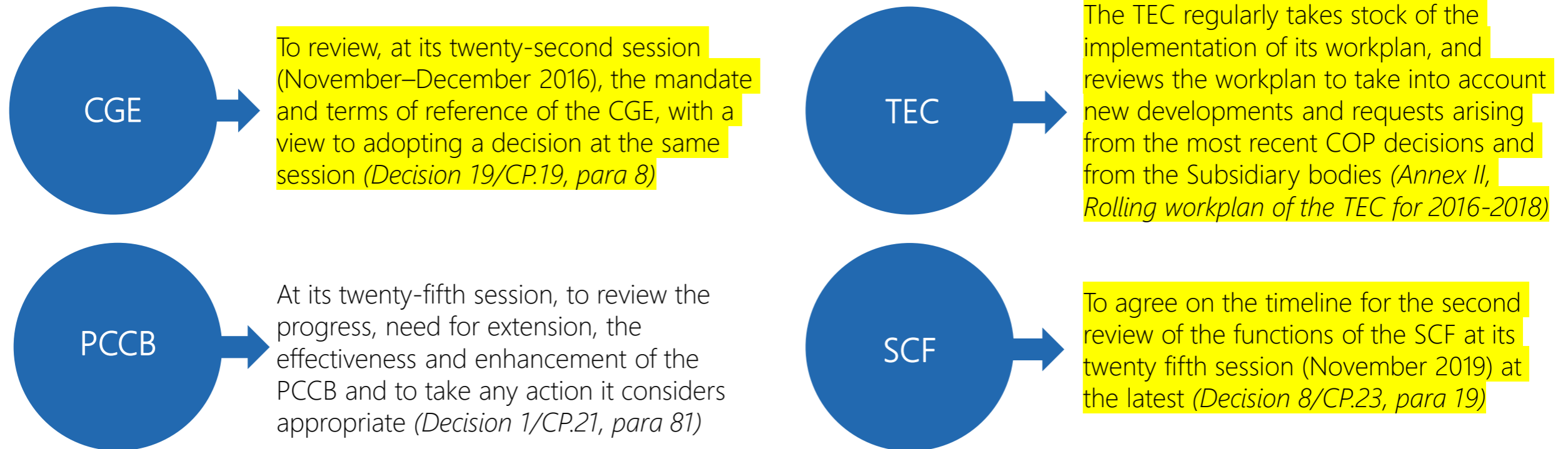


- Review, at its ninth session, the progress, need for continuation and terms of reference of the group, including the duration of the term of office of its members, and to adopt a decision thereon (*Decision 29/CP.7, para 4*)



- Review the Warsaw international mechanism, including its structure, mandate and effectiveness, at the twenty-second session of the COP, with a view to adopting an appropriate decision on the outcome of this review (*Decision 2/CP.19, para 15*)

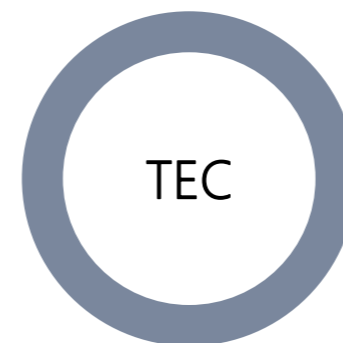


- The AC and the LEG to undertake three inter-related tasks to assist implementation of the Paris Agreement, with outputs to be considered by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its first session, CMA1 (*Decision 1/CP.21, para 41 & 45*)
- The WIM shall collaborate with existing bodies and expert groups under the Agreement, as well as relevant organizations and expert bodies outside the Agreement (*Article 9(5), Paris Agreement*)

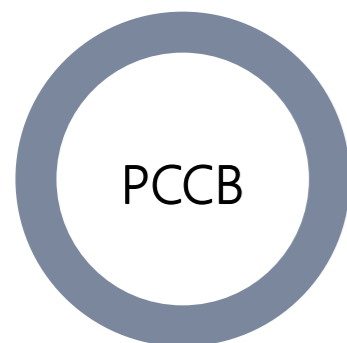

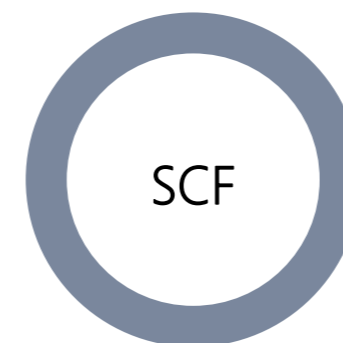
- The CGE shall serve the Paris Agreement starting from 1 January 2019 to support the implementation of the enhanced transparency framework under Article 13 of the Paris Agreement (*Decision -/CP.24, para 4*)



- The Technology Mechanism established under the Convention shall serve this Agreement (*Article 10(3), Paris Agreement*);
- TEC and the CTNC, [...] shall implement the technology framework in close collaboration under the guidance of the COP serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (*Decision 15/CMA.1, para 2*)



- Should enhance the capacity and ability of developing country Parties, in particular countries with the least capacity, [...] and those that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change, [...] to take effective climate change action [...] (*Article 11(1), Paris Agreement*)



- The SCF shall serve the Paris Agreement in line with its functions and responsibilities established under the COP (*Decision 1/CP.21, para 63*)
