Item 1. Opening and organizational matters

a. Opening

b. Notification of any changes to membership or new members The secretariat will announce any relevant changes to membership that have taken place since FWG 4, December 2020. 1 This agenda item will only be discussed if there are any changes or additions to the FWG membership.

c. Adoption of agenda

The proposed provisional agenda will have been made available by the outgoing cochairs to the FWG members well in advance of the meeting. Members have been asked to share their views in advance of the meeting, so that revisions during the meeting would not be necessary or would be minimal.

Action: The provisional agenda will be adopted as is, or with revisions agreed by consensus by the members.

Item 2: The implementation status of the LCIPP initial two-year workplan activities

For each activity, members assigned as co-leads, as well as the secretariat, will briefly summarize achievements and insights gained. After each activity, FWG members will share their reflections and advice, and the floor will be opened for contributors to also pose questions and to comment.

Contributor time to comment: The Co-Chairs may invite contributors to share brief comments on respective activities after all activities have been reviewed by the FWG. FWG members should exercise discipline in their review of activities to respect time designated for comments from contributors.

Item 3: Review of all LCIPP initial two-year workplan activities achieved

Decision 2/CP.24 paragraph 27 states (text in brackets updates relevant sessions in accordance with Bureau guidance during the pandemic):

"... the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice will review the outcomes and activities of the Facilitative Working Group, taking into account the reports referred to in paragraph 24 above, at its [session corresponding to COP 26] and make recommendations to the Conference of the Parties at [COP 26] with a view to the Conference of the Parties adopting a decision on the outcome of this review;"

Under item 3, FWG members may discuss its outcomes and activities in advance of SBSTA's review during session.

Contributor time to comment: The Co-Chairs may invite contributors to share brief comments on the overall work and achievements of the FWG including activities under the initial two-year workplan, in the context of SBSTA's review of FWG in session.

Item 4: Plans for implementing activities under the proposed second three-year workplan

The FWG will be invited to discuss how proposed activities under the LCIPP draft second three-year workplan could be sequenced to maximize synergy, and how relevant activities could possibly be implemented in the first half of 2022

a. Presentation of the draft LCIPP 2nd three-year workplan^[1]

Action: The secretariat will present the draft LCIPP 2nd three-year workplan and a possible sequencing and timeline for FWG consideration. The secretariat will explain how, once endorsed, workplan and its activities are included in budget discussions, and where needed the secretariat undertakes any additional resource mobilization.

b. Develop timeline and sequencing of activities of draft 2nd three-year workplan

Action: The FWG discuss and recommend a timeline and sequencing of activities under the draft 2^{nd} three-year workplan should the SBSTA recommend its endorsement to the COP.

c. Discuss development of draft concept notes for workplan activities to commence after endorsement of the 2nd three-year workplan

Action: The FWG discuss and recommend co-leads or other ways to initiate those workplan activities which might be sequenced for the first half of 2022, so that no time is lost in implementation, should the SBSTA recommend its endorsement to the COP. Such initiation of workplan activities would take into account discussions from FWG 5 including those captured in a long document of ideas including inputs form contributors at FWG 5.

Item 5: Discuss draft input paper to the global stocktake

Decision 19/CMA.1 paragraph 6 established a technical dialogue to support the work of the SBI and SBSTA's joint contact group. Paragraph 24 of this decision invites relevant constituted bodies to prepare information in their areas of expertise for the technical assessment, with the assistance of the secretariat.

The Chairs of the SBSTA and SBI prepared a non-paper for the subsidiary body session with further information, including an overview of the process and indicative timeline. The FWG is invited to submit its report by February 2022 (indicative).

Paragraph 36 of this decision indicates the areas of information at a collective level as sources of input for the global stocktake. These include information on greenhouse gas emissions (36(a)), overall effect of nationally determined contributions (36(b)), the state of adaptation efforts (36(c)), finance flows (36(d)), efforts to avert, minimize and address the adverse impacts of climate change (36(e)), barriers and challenges to means of implementation (36(f)), good practices, experience and potential opportunities to enhance relevant international cooperation (36(g)), and fairness considerations, including equity, as communicated in nationally determined contributions (36(h))..

At FWG 6, members will review an initial draft, provide comments and further deliberate on the relevant information they wish to convey to the global stocktake process.

Action: The secretariat will present an overview of the draft document related to the FWG inputs to first technical dialogue, as part of the global stocktake technical assessment.

Item 6: Enhancing the coherence of the actions of the LCIPP

a. Relevant processes and bodies under the Convention COP 24 encouraged the FWG to collaborate with other bodies under and outside the Convention, as appropriate, aiming at enhancing the coherence of the actions of the LCIPP under the Convention.4

As in all previous FWG meetings, this item provides members and contributors to discuss intersessional and in-session activities that contributed to building coherence. These include FWG member participation in meetings of the SBSTA Chair and other constituted bodies, participation on invitation by UN agencies, informal open dialogues between Parties and indigenous peoples and local communities, and informal intersessional dialogues with contributors to the LCIPP.

Action: The secretariat will update the members on any coherence-building activities planned in conjunction with COP 26, and any invitations received from other bodies/processes.

The FWG members can discuss how to continue to take this coherence forward under the Convention. A dialogue can be held during this agenda item: Members of other constituted bodies and other contributors can discuss potential synergies and collaborative opportunities between FWG and their respective work under the Convention.

Progress/ongoing collaboration under the Convention between the FWG and, *inter alia*, the Nairobi work programme (NWP), Paris Committee on Capacity Building (PCCB), Global Stocktake (GST), Adaptation Committee, the Consultative Group of Experts (CGE), the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts (WIM) Excom and expert group on non-economic losses (NELs), and the Lima Work Programme on Gender will be discussed, building on from previous discussions. This will include updates by members on any meetings members have attended on behalf of the FWG.

Further, consideration of gender is integral to the successful implementation of the functions of the LCIPP. COP 24, through decision 2, para 14, stresses the importance of striving for gender balance in the appointment processes of representatives on the FWG in accordance with relevant COP decisions. Decision 21/CP.22 requested all constituted bodies under the UNFCCC process to include in their regular reports information on progress made towards integrating a gender perspective in their processes.

b. Relevant process and bodies outside the Convention

Members may also discuss collaboration and partnership outside of the Convention, including related to the UN Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues (UNPFII) and the Interagency Support Group on Indigenous Issues (IASG), the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), the Indigenous Peoples Major Group for Sustainable Development (IPMG) and the Center for International Environmental Law (CIEL).

The FWG members can discuss how to continue to further take this coherence forward. Based on the relevance of their work to the functions of the LCIPP, contributors to the FWG 6 meeting can discuss potential synergies and collaborative opportunities between FWG and their respective work, and upcoming meetings to take place in 2022.

Item 7: Any other matters

The FWG will be invited to take up any other matters, including, for example, any intersessional work leading up to FWG 6.

a. Draft FWG rules of procedure

FWG has informally discussed rules of procedure and may examine examples from other constituted bodies. As part of the LCIPP deliberations under the SBSTA, Parties may discuss a decision that could include a recommendation for the FWG to develop its rules of procedure.

Action: The secretariat will provide an overview and accompany informal note about the draft rules of procedure of other constituted bodies.

- b. Submission of resources via the LCIPP web portal
- c. Relevant articles of the Paris Agreement

FWG may discuss relevant articles of the Paris Agreement, including Articles 6 (market-based mechanisms), Article 13 (enhanced transparency framework), Article 14 (global stocktake) or others.

Item 8: Closing

a. Date of the next meeting (FWG 7)

COP 24 decided that the FWG will meet twice per year in conjunction with the sessions of the subsidiary bodies and the session of the Conference of the Parties. Due to the evolving COVID-19 pandemic, the COP Bureau decided to allow bodies the flexibility to de-link their meetings form the sessions, to ensure that they could still hold the mandated number of meetings per year. The FWG will be invited to consider and agree

on the dates of its next meeting, FWG 7. The first sessional period of the SBSTA and SBI will be from 6 to 16 June 2022.1

Action: The FWG will be invited to consider and agree on the dates of its next meeting.

b. Reporting arrangements and intersessional work

A discussion on reporting arrangements, as well as deadlines and intersessional work.

c. Closing remarks by the FWG Co-Chairs. Other speakers to be confirmed.
