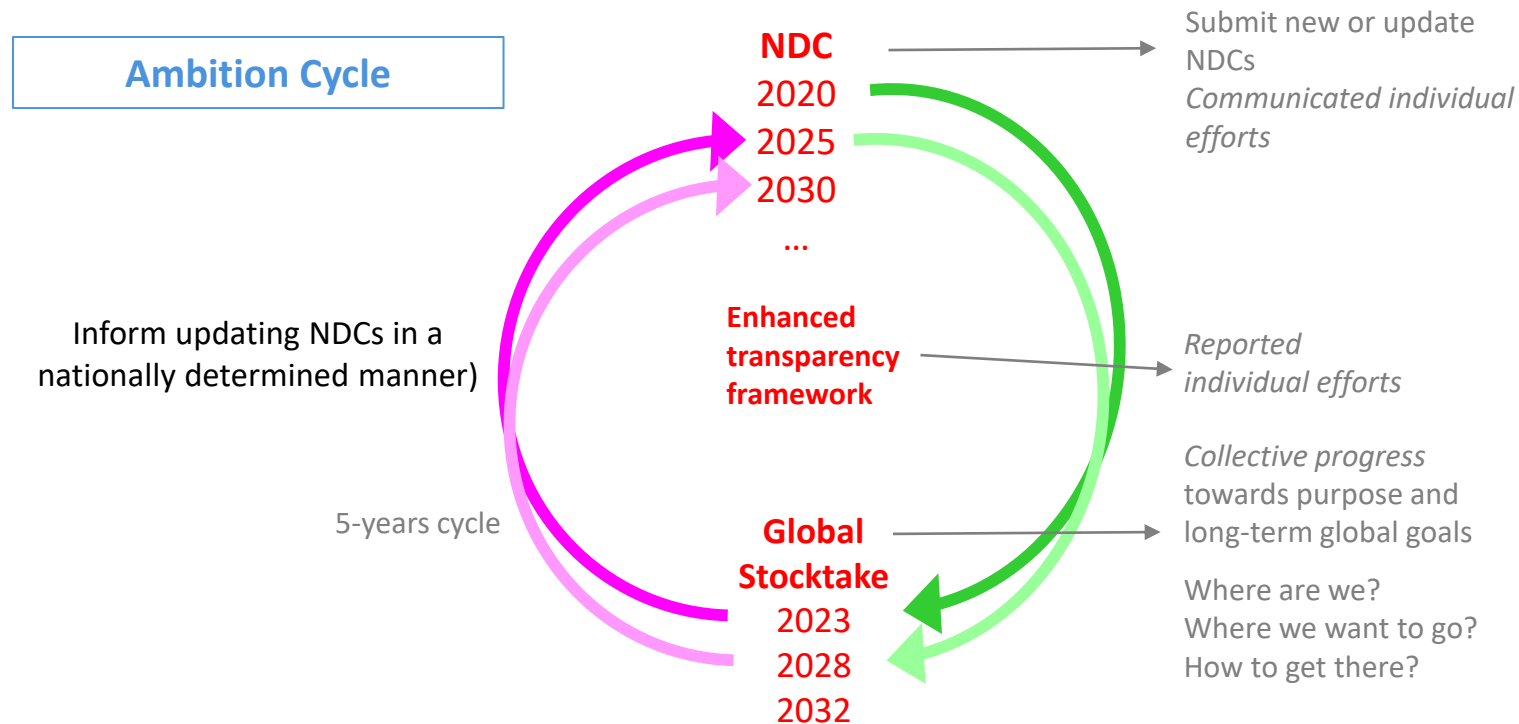

Global Stocktake - the What

Paris Agreement Article 14:

- Take stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement – assess collective progress towards achieving its purpose and its long-term goals, but also identifying opportunities for enhancing ambition moving forward
- First GST in 2023 and then every 5 years
- Outcome shall inform Parties in updating and enhancing NDCs and enhancing international cooperation for climate action



Global Stocktake - the Themes



Mitigation

- State of GHG emissions and removals and mitigation efforts undertaken by Parties
- Overall effect of NDCs



Adaptation

- State of adaptation efforts, support, experiences and priorities
- Observed and projected risks



Finance flows and means of Implementation and support

- Finance flows and financial support
- Technology
- Capacity-Building



Response Measures and Loss & Damage

- Address the social and economic consequences and impacts of response measures;
- Avert, minimize and address loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change

Global Stocktake - the How

Decision 19/CMA.1

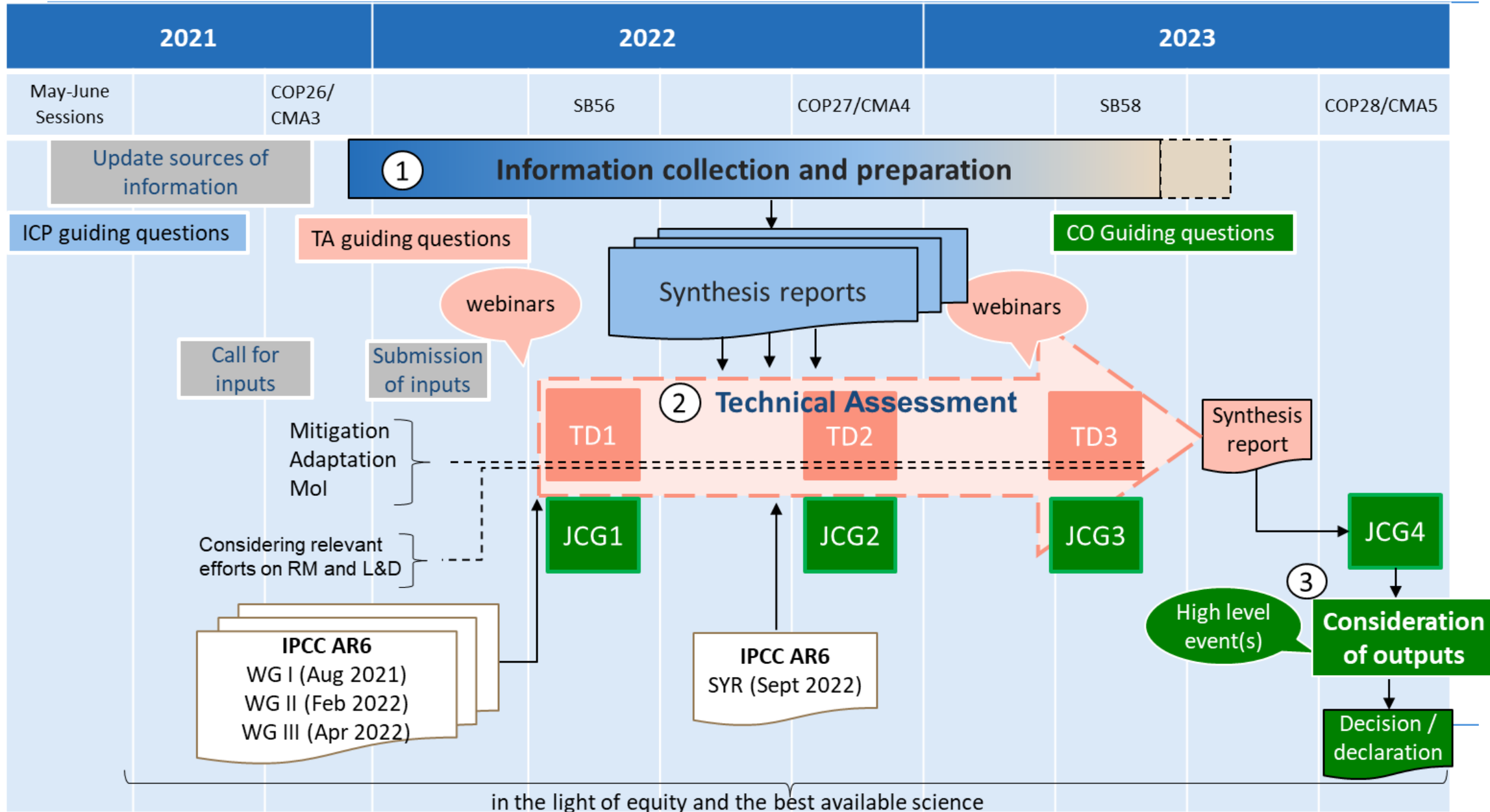
Three components:

- 1. Information collection and preparation:** gathering, compiling and synthesizing information
- 2. Technical assessment:** assessing collective progress, including through information analysis and meetings of the technical dialogue
- 3. Consideration of outputs:** discussing the implications of the findings



Guiding questions for each component

Global Stocktake - the When



How to engage?

Parties, observers and Non-Party stakeholders

1) Submissions

- Written inputs prior to TDs
 - Input to inform all thematic areas, based on equity and the best available science
 - ❖ Possibility to update and add new information prior to next two TDs
- Synthesizing information (group submissions are particularly welcome)

2) Participation in the meetings of the Technical Dialogue

- Interactive discussions among Parties, observers and NPS

3) Voluntary intersessional engagement

- E.g. convening preparatory and intersessional meetings (including at local, national and regional level) that can be transformed into written input

The GST technical dialogue (TD)

- Technical Dialogue (TD) will address all GST themes:
 - Mitigation
 - Adaptation
 - Means of implementation and support
 - Efforts related to response measures and loss and damage, as appropriate
 - CFs published an **information note** with the details on the organization of the session:
 - Roundtables on mitigation, adaptation and MOI
 - World Café with tables on all three themes, focused on implementation
 - Opening and closing plenaries
 - Participation:
 - 20 Party representatives for each roundtable, nominated by negotiation groups
 - 9 observers (nominated by constituencies, including **Indigenous Peoples organizations**) + 6 other NPS (EoI process) per roundtable
 - Meetings are open
 - All events except World Café to be livestreamed

Roundtables

Purpose: real dialogue, interactive exchange

Format:

- 2 moderators per roundtable, plus experts for short panel presentations.
- Each roundtable will have three discussions:
 - **Discussion 1:** CFs will attend and introduce; questions on process and substantive focus
 - **Discussion 2:** Two expert panels, followed by discussion
 - **Discussion 3:** One expert panel; feedback to closing plenary (rapporteur)
- If meetings run out of time, participants can submit in writing



World Café

- **Format:**
- 12 stations that cover issues drawn from inputs
- 3-hour session - participants are expected to move to a new station at every 30 minutes (so one participant could visit 6 out of the 12 stations), though participants are free to move more frequently
- 1 or 2 experts per table
- Main points raised will be recorded in flipcharts
