Midyear climate negotiation (SB 56)

6 June – 16 June 2022



SB 56

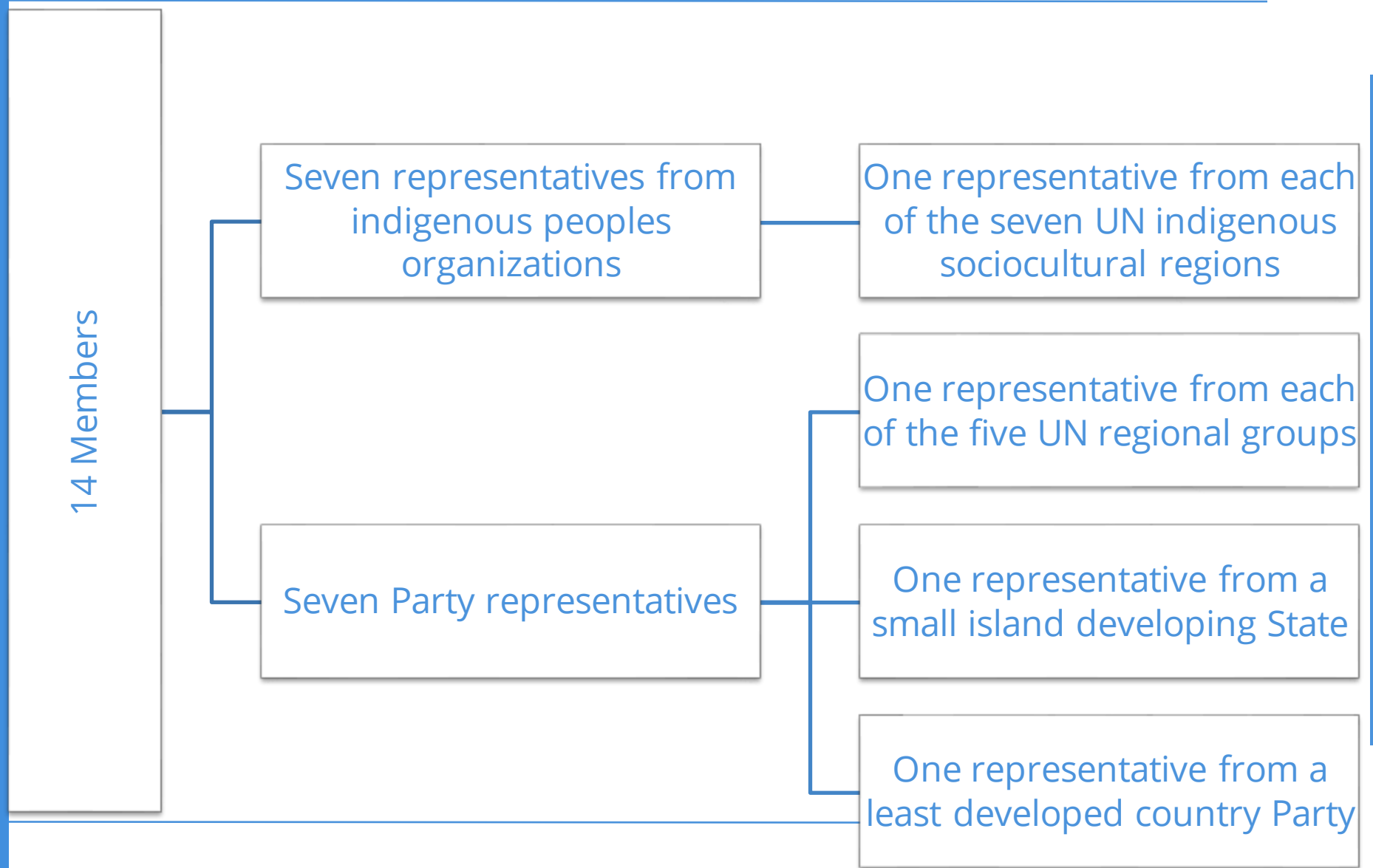
- Convened the first technical dialogue of the **global stocktake** (GST)
- Convened a series of workshops under the Glasgow-Sharm el-Sheikh work programme on the **global goal on adaptation** (GGA)
- Requested the secretariat to organize, under the guidance of SB Chairs, a pre-sessional workshop on the work programme to scale up mitigation ambition and implementation
- Convened the second technical expert dialogue on **new quantified goal on climate finance**

Facilitative Working Group of the LCIPP



7th Meeting of the FWG

- Instated FWG new members
- Elected new FWG Co-Chairs and Vice Co-Chairs
- Designated FWG focal points for relevant UNFCCC constituted bodies to advance the contributions and participation of indigenous peoples and local communities in relation to the work of constituted bodies
- Decided to update its synthesis report as input to the global stocktake to include additional practices and knowledge of indigenous peoples and local knowledge systems
- Agreed ways forward for implementing the second three-year workplan of the LCIPP, including designated of activity co-leads

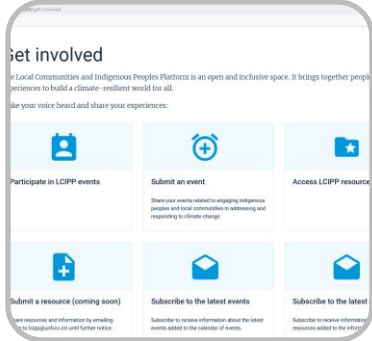

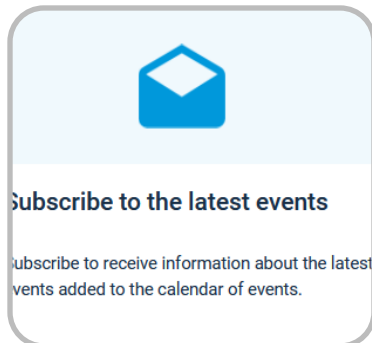

Global Stocktake (GST)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Non-Party Stakeholder participation encouraged in the second meeting of the GST technical dialogue at SB 57/COP27• Several Parties and NPS called for having indigenous knowledge featured in the roundtables and World Café• As <u>SB56 conclusion</u>, Parties and non-Party stakeholders encouraged to hold events, at the local, national, regional and international level, as appropriate, in support of the global stocktake
Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1st workshop under the Glasgow–Sharm el-Sheikh work programme on the global goal on adaptation (<u>FCCC/SB/2022/L.7</u>)• <u>Synthesis report</u> highlighting the priority of social inclusion, empowering the most vulnerable, including women, youth, indigenous peoples and those with disabilities, and the need for gender-responsive and human rights-based approaches• <u>Submission portal</u> for subsequent workshops to be designed in such a way that takes into account the impact of adaptation activities and decisions on the rights, knowledge systems, practices, and ways of life of indigenous peoples.

Matters relating to capacity-building (<u>FCCC/SBI/2022/2</u>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Capacity needed for encouraging cooperation from industry and the public and implementing programme in agriculture providing incentives to farmers and introducing certification to support organic farming, in addition to promoting traditional indigenous practices• Growing focus on strengthening institutional and individual capacity at the subnational, sectoral and local level, including for industry, cities, local government, small to medium-sized enterprises, local communities and indigenous peoples, given their critical role in fulfilling national climate commitments and pursuing the 1.5 °C global temperature
Gender and Climate change (<u>FCCC/SBI/2022/8</u>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• promote travel funds as a means of supporting the equal participation of women, grass-roots local and indigenous peoples' communities from developing countries, the least developed countries and small island developing States and encourage Parties and relevant organizations in all national delegations at UNFCCC sessions;• Strengthen gender integration and gender-responsive technological solutions including protecting and preserving local, indigenous, and traditional knowledge and practices

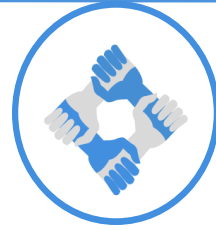
