

Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform (LCIPP) facilitates the exchange of experiences and good practices toward building a climate-resilient world for all.



The LCIPP made momentous progress since Paris 2015





Functions

The platform should **promote the exchange of experience and best practices** with a view to applying, strengthening, protecting and preserving traditional knowledge, knowledge of indigenous peoples and local knowledge systems, as well as technologies, practices and efforts of local communities and indigenous peoples related to addressing and responding to climate change, taking into account the free, prior and informed consent of the holders of such knowledge, innovations and practices



KNOWLEDGE



The platform should **build the capacity of indigenous peoples and local communities** to enable their engagement in the UNFCCC process and the **capacity of Parties and other relevant stakeholders** to engage with the platform and with local communities and indigenous peoples, including in the context of the implementation of the Paris Agreement and other climate change related processes

(Decision 2/CP.23, para 6)

The platform should facilitate the **integration of diverse knowledge systems, practices and innovations designing and implementing international and national actions**, programmes and **policies** in a manner that respects and promotes the rights and interests of local communities and indigenous peoples. The platform should also facilitate the undertaking of stronger and more ambitious climate action by indigenous peoples and local communities that could contribute to the achievement of the nationally determined contributions of the Parties concerned

to explore gender-responsive ways and means to strengthen the engagement of youth, and participation in intergenerational knowledge-sharing and continuing/strengthening practices on the ground, as well to contribute to climate policies and actions at the national and international level





Objectives of Activity 8 : Annual Youth Round Table

Enhancing the 1. understanding of the substance and procedures of the UNFCCC, both within and outside the Convention, and the important linkages between the international human rights standards of Indigenous peoples and the UNFCCC and other climate-related intergovernmental initiatives, including the IPCC

2. Enhancing the engagement of indigenous youth and youth from local communities in climate policy development and implementation at all levels 3. Facilitating the participation of indigenous youth and youth from local communities in intergenerational knowledge-sharing, strengthening practices on the ground and promoting intergenerational equity



Deliverables:

- **Knowledge-gathering** devoted to intergenerational knowledge-sharing, intergenerational equity, strengthening relevant practices on the ground, and enhancing youth engagement in climate policy development and implementation at all levels with a view to developing recommendations on how to enhance the leadership of indigenous youth and youth from local communities;
- Recommendations from indigenous youth participants and youth participants from local communities, ensuring gender and sociocultural balance, on the promotion of their participation in the activities of the FWG, as well as opportunities to enhance knowledge-sharing, capacity building and policy for integration under the UNFCCC process.

Paris Agreement

Acknowledging that climate change is a common concern of humankind, should, when taking action to address climate change, respect, promote and consider their respective obligations on human rights, the right to health, the rights of indigenous peoples, local communities, migrants, children, persons with disabilities and people in vulnerable situations and the right to development, as well as gender equality, empowerment of women and intergenerational equity





"Recognizes the need to strengthen knowledge, technologies, practices and efforts of local communities and indigenous peoples related to addressing and responding to climate change, and establishes a platform for the exchange of experiences and sharing of best practices on mitigation and adaptation in a holistic and integrated manner"




