



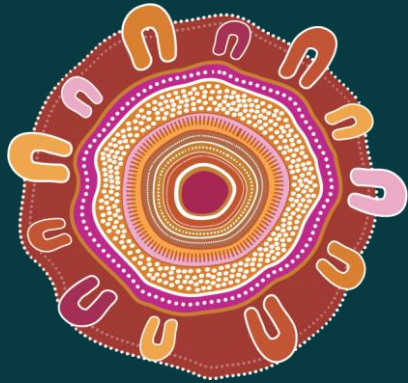

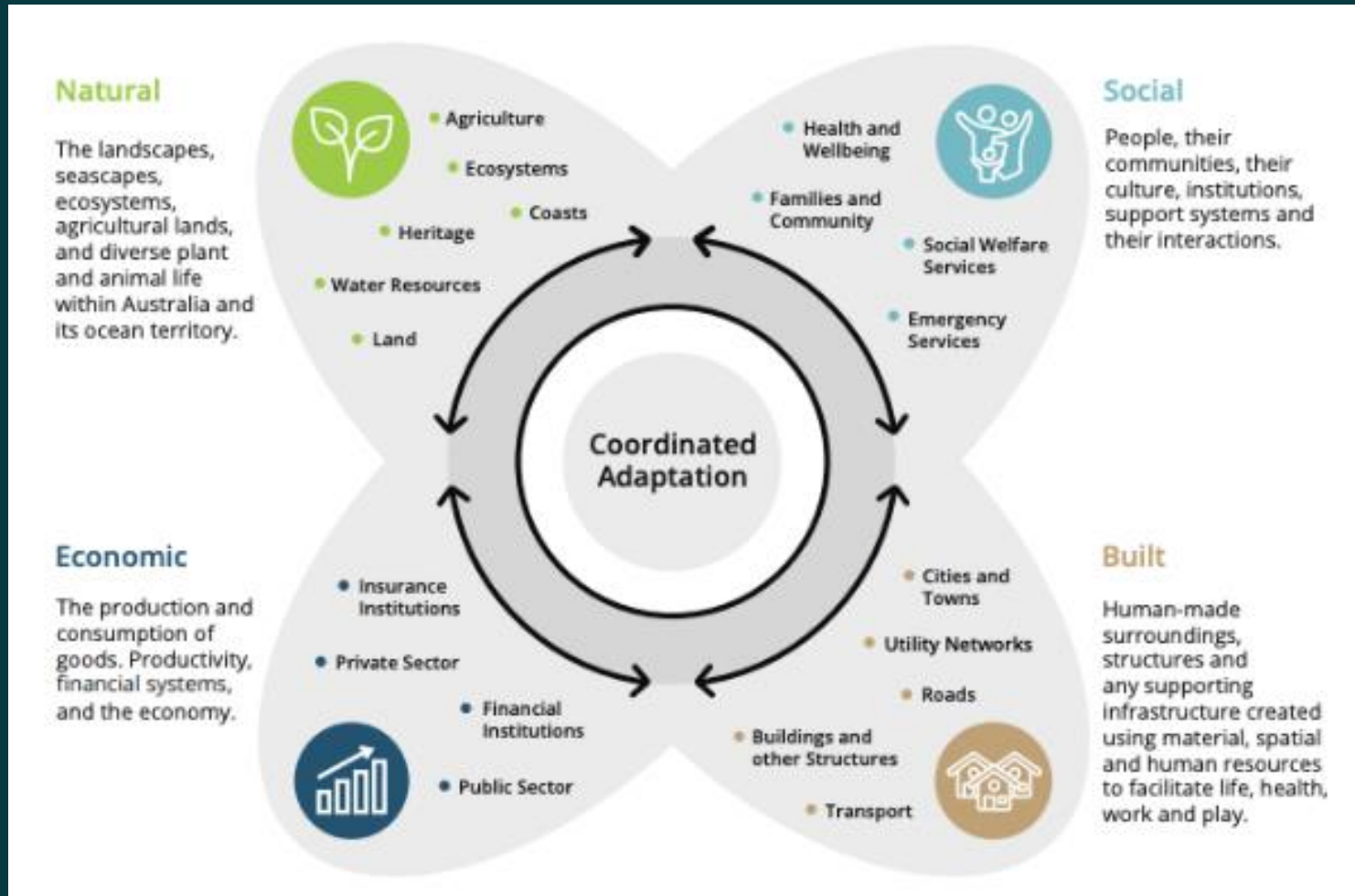

Australia's National Adaptation Plan

- The National Adaptation Plan will be the first truly national plan in Australia
 - We are ensuring the National Adaptation Plan will reflect a national vision for adaptation.
 - A dedicated First Nations Values and Knowledge system in the National Risk Assessment to be analysed in collaboration with First Australians.

First Nations Climate Adaptation

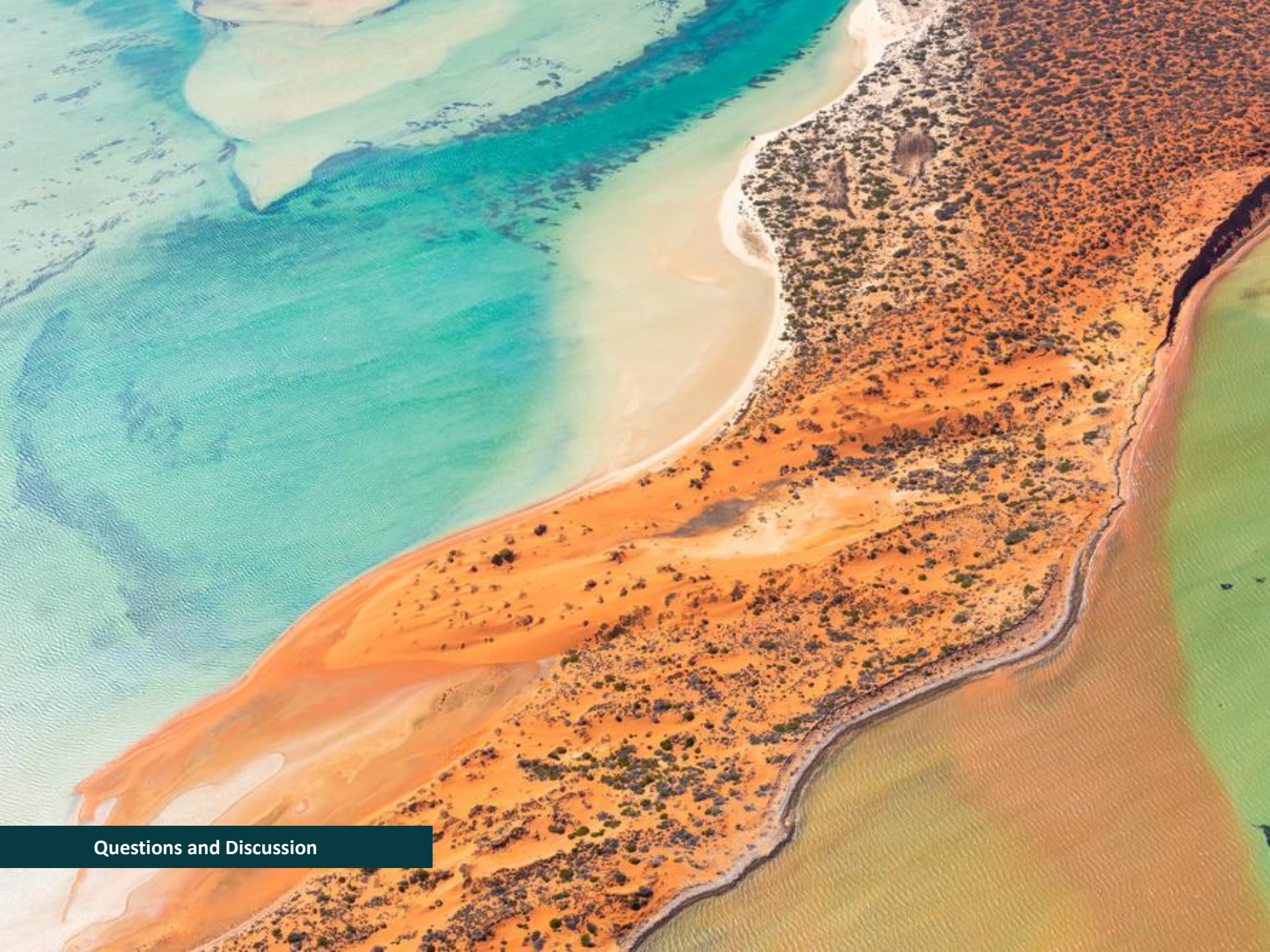
- The science, knowledge and practices of First Nations peoples is critical to climate action
 - Establishment of a climate centre focused on the Torres Strait and Northern Peninsula Area
 - Supporting private investment in natural capital and nature-based solutions for climate adaptation

Indigenous Rangers Program & Indigenous Protected Areas

- Doubling of the number of Indigenous rangers
 - This is leading to improvements in modern environmental science and contemporary approaches to land and water management.

NESP National First Peoples Platform on Climate Change

- The NESP Climate Systems Hub is bringing together Traditional Owner participants from across Australia to create the National First Peoples Platform on Climate Change (NFPPCC)
 - The NFPPCC committee gathered recently in the Torres Strait Islands and will meet regularly over the next 5 years
