KNOWLEDGE

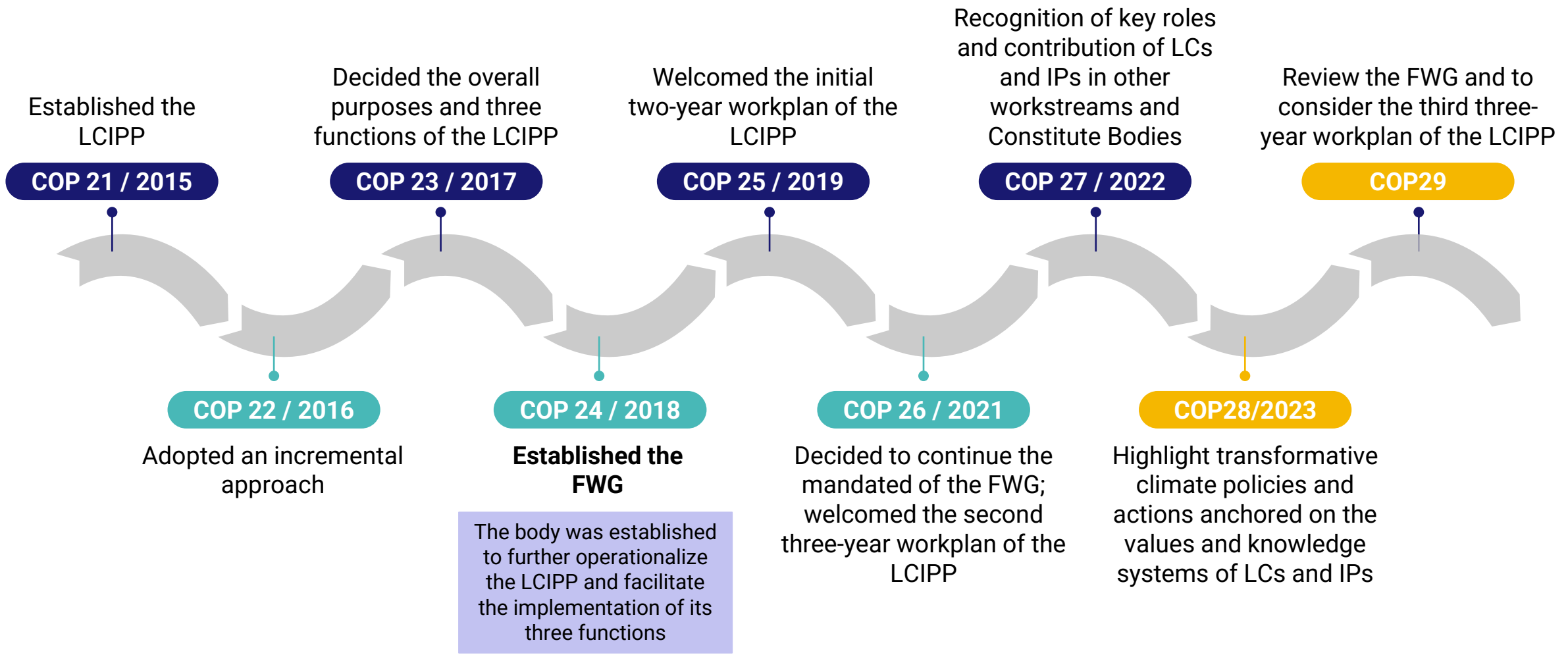

CAPACITY FOR ENGAGEMENT

Build capacity of indigenous peoples and local communities to engage in the UNFCCC process and capacity of Parties to engage with the platform and with indigenous peoples and local communities

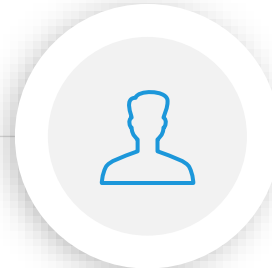

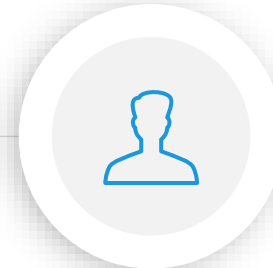

Put nature at the heart of transformative climate action

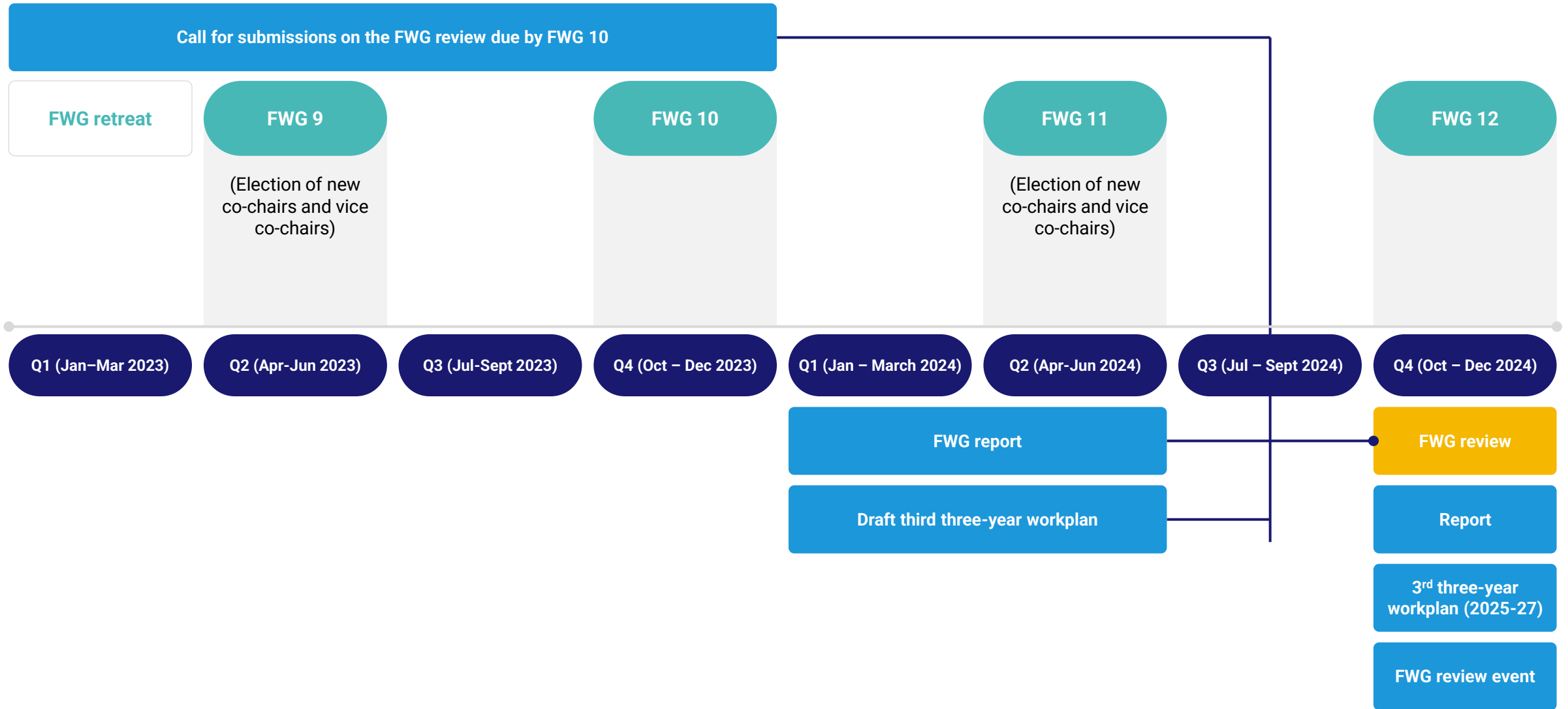

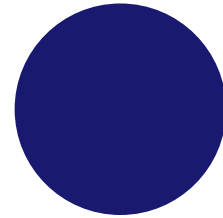

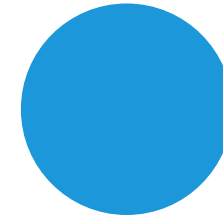
Key Opportunities to Contribute in 2023 and 2024

Submit inputs to the UNFCCC Submission Portal on or before 28 November 2023



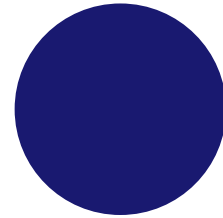
LCIPP Third Three-Year Work Plan

The workplan will be adopted at COP29

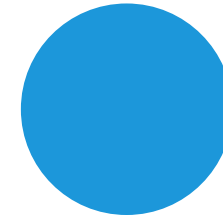
