keep temperature increase to well below +2 /1.5 degrees C

Adaptation

increase the ability to adapt and foster resilience

Finance flows consistent with path to low GHG emissions and resilient development

Ambition Cycle Plan and commit national action Mitigation, National Targets Implement Adaptation, (NDC) 2020 Support national action => every 5 y) Higher Enhanced National Transparency Ambition Framework Account for national action Global Stocktake (2023 => every 5 y)

Review collective action against goals and commit to further action

2023: some progress, but not enough: implementation and ambition gap





Outcome of the first Global Stocktake

GST Decision text 1/CMA 5

Collective progress and informing action and support



Mitigation: Keep 1.5° in reach, Urgent deep GHG emissions reduction, Transitioning away from fossil fuels, Tripling renewable energy, doubling energy efficiency, Halting deforestation and forest degradation, Encourage economy wide NDCs



Adaptation: Incremental, multisectoral and transformational actions, universal Early Warning Systems, adaptation targets to reach global goal on adaptation, Enhance national adaptation plans and adaptation communications



MOI: Scaling up mobilization, \$100bn commitment, doubling adaptation finance, support NCQG, Technology Implementation Programme, Capacity building support

Advancing the Global Goal on Adaptation

UAE Framework for Global Climate Resilience

The UAE Framework for Global Climate Resilience guides the achievement of Global Goal on Adaptation (GGA) and reviews the overall progress in adapting to climate change. It presents a comprehensive approach to enhance adaptive capacity, strengthen resilience & reduce vulnerability to climate change.

KEY ASPECTS OF THE FRAMEWORK



Focuses on well-being of people, protection of livelihoods, economies, & nature preservation and regeneration



Adaptation efforts should be country-driven, voluntary, and tailored to national circumstances.



Highlights importance of scaling up of adaptation finance & making it timely & predictable



Emphasizes on the importance of early warning systems to strengthen of adaptation action



Forms a two-year work programme to develop indicators to measure progress



Emphasizes the need to examine transformational adaptation at different scales and sectors

KEY SECTORS PRIORITIZED IN THE FRAMEWORK



WATER & SANITATION

Reducing climate-induced water scarcity & attaining climateresilient water supply & sanitation and access to safe & affordable potable water for all



FOOD & AGRICULTURE

Enhancing climate resilient food and ag production, supply & distribution and equitable access to adequate food and nutrition for all



HEALTH

Attaining health resilience against climate change and promoting climate-resilient health services & reducing climate-related morbidity



ECOSYSTEMS

Accelerating ecosystem based adaptation and nature-based solutions



INFRASTRUCTURES

Building climate resilient infrastructures and human settlements to ensure essential services for all



LIVELIHOODS

Reducing climate impacts on poverty eradication & livelihoods, and promoting adaptive social protection



CULTURAL HERITAGE

Protecting cultural heritage from climate-related risks guided by traditional, Indigeneous Peoples and local knowledge

IMPLEMENTATION

Progress in implementing NAP policies, strategies & reduce impacts of climate hazards



MONITORING, EVALUATION, LEARNING


