

Annual training workshops for Indigenous Peoples and local communities

Activity 4 of the second three-year workplan of the LCIPP

Background:

One of the deliverables under Activity 4 of the current three-year (2022-2024) workplan of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform (LCIPP), is for the LCIPP's Facilitative Working Group (FWG) to organize training workshops for Indigenous Peoples and local communities, including youth. These are meant to provide information on the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) process, the LCIPP, ways to support implementation of the Paris Agreement and opportunities for the involvement of Indigenous Peoples and local communities.

Four virtual and in-person training modules have been held so far (see below for more information, including links to the recordings).

The fifth training module of the training will take place on October 15 (Session 1) and October 17 (Session 2)
