Unique Feature: Co-Chairs from Party and IPO Representative


The FWG facilitates the implementation of the LCIPP's three functions

- Party representatives are appointed by their respective regional groups and constituencies, and Indigenous Peoples representatives are appointed by the Indigenous Peoples, through their focal points
- Serve for a term of three years and not eligible to serve two consecutive terms
- New members of the Facilitative Working Group will soon be nominated from 2025-2027
