Functions of the LCIPP

Knowledge

Promote the exchange of experience and best practices of Indigenous Peoples and local communities to address climate change in a holistic manner.

Capacity for engagement

Build capacity of Indigenous Peoples and local communities to engage in the UNFCCC process and capacity of Parties to engage with the platform and with Indigenous Peoples and local communities.

Climate change policies and actions

Facilitate the integration of knowledge systems, practices and innovations in designing and implementing international and national actions, programmes and policies.

The Baku Workplan of the LCIPP (2025–2027)

Following the implementation of two previous workplans, the Baku Workplan is the third workplan of the LCIPP and the first workplan of a constituted body to be fully embraced and named by the COP after its host city.

Through its six Collective Approaches, the Baku Workplan will focus on weaving Indigenous Peoples' knowledge, values and worldviews and local community perspectives into the UNFCCC process to transform global climate policies and actions.

Facilitative Working Group (FWG)

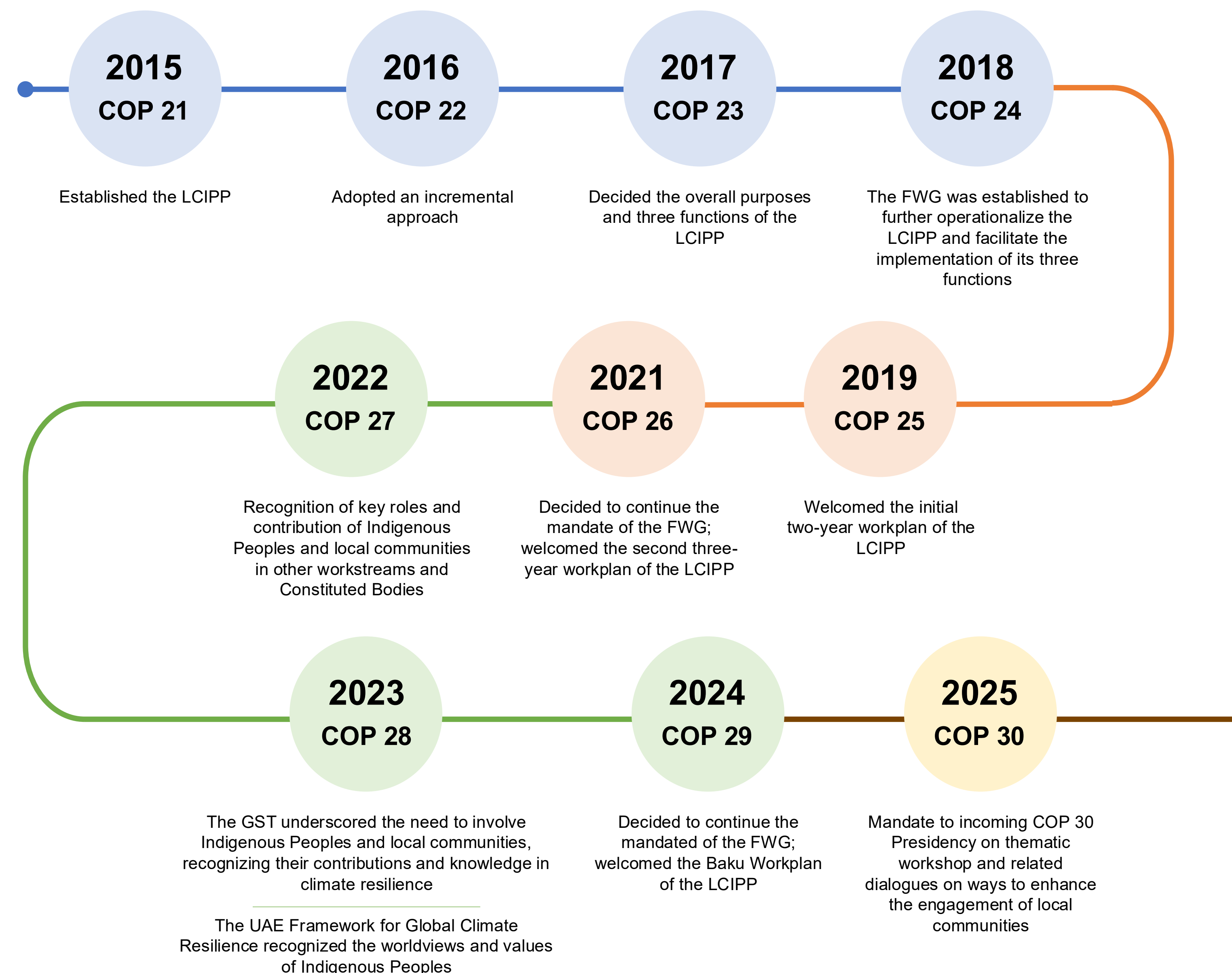
The FWG is a constituted body established under the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement to further operationalize the LCIPP. The FWG is comprised of 14 members: 7 Party representatives and 7 representatives from Indigenous Peoples organizations (IPO).

Vision and Strategy of the FWG

The FWG, in implementing the three functions of the Platform, strives to elevate the leadership role of Indigenous Peoples and local communities in the collective effort toward transformative climate policies and actions by:

- Upholding a rights-based approach.
- Ethically and equitably engaging Indigenous values and worldviews, (such as stewardship of and living in harmony with Mother Earth to ensure its enduring integrity for all life forms today and in the future), and perspectives from local communities.
- Fostering full and effective participation of Indigenous Peoples and local communities in achieving the objectives of the Convention, Kyoto Protocol, and the Paris Agreement.
