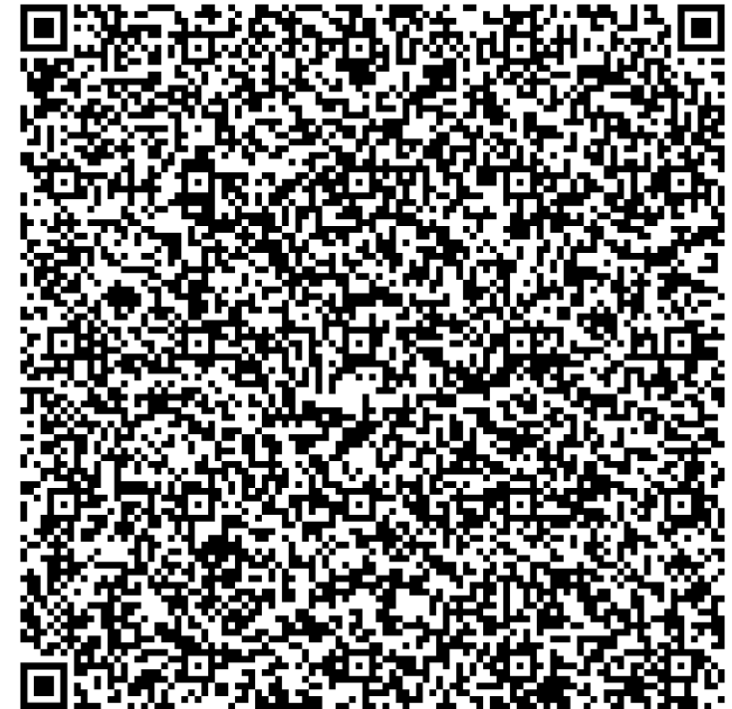

NDCs with references related to Indigenous Peoples (2016-2022)

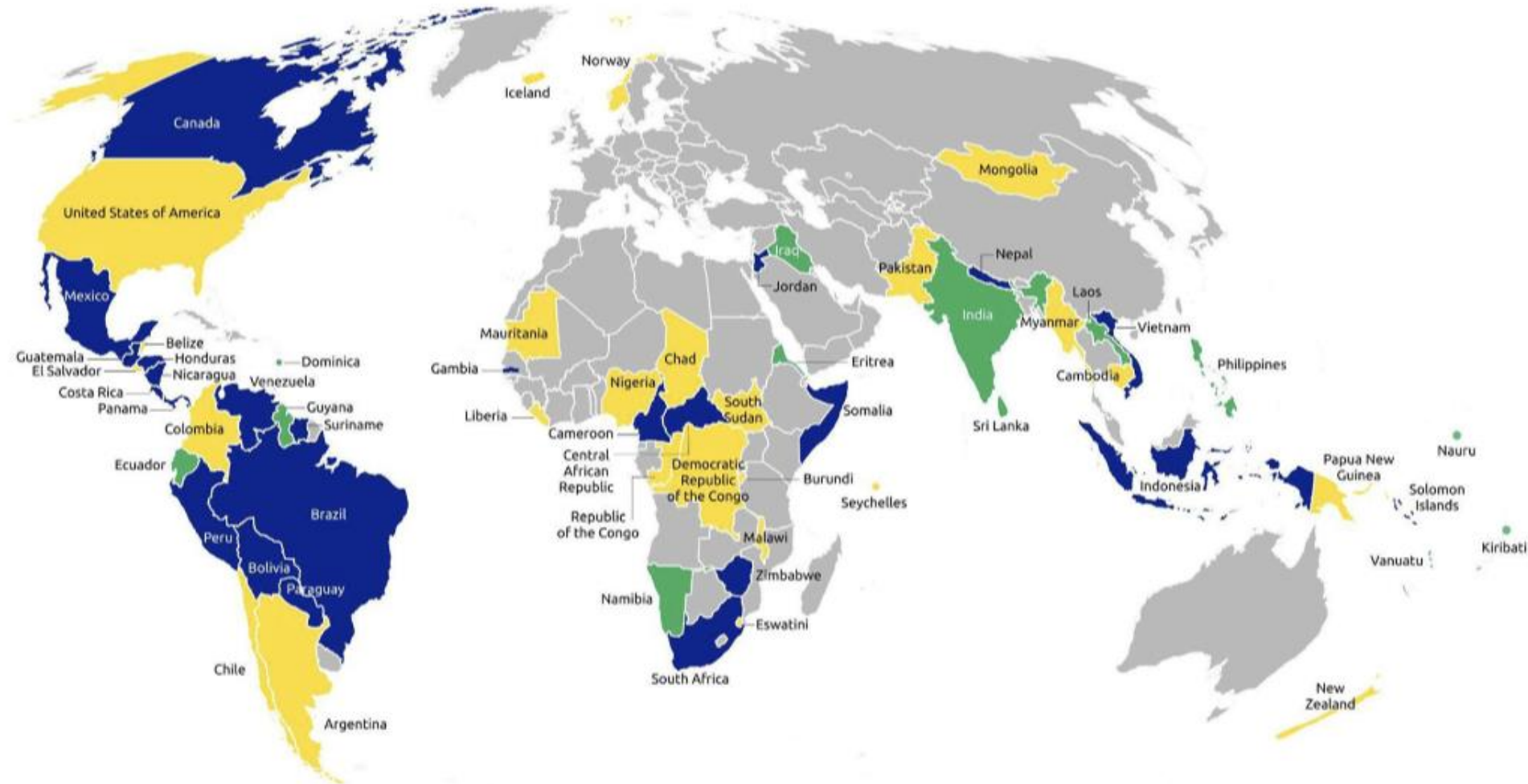
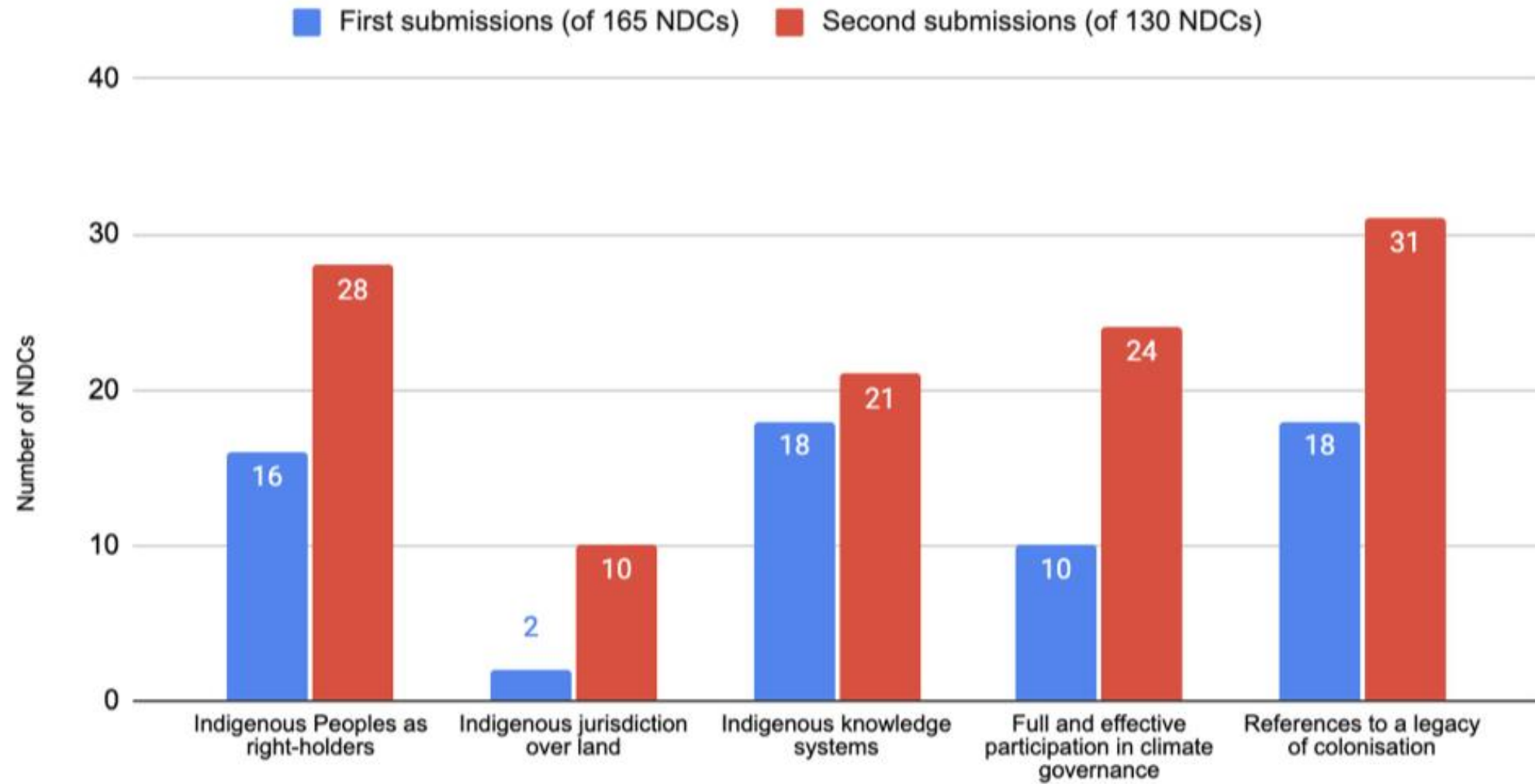


Fig. 2 NDCs with references related to Indigenous Peoples in the first and second submissions. Green represents Parties that only made a first submission which included references related to Indigenous Peoples. Yellow represents Parties that made a second submission which included references related to Indigenous Peoples. Blue represents Parties that made a first and second submission which both included references related to Indigenous Peoples. Map elaborated by Robert Petitpas

Recommendations

Respect, promote and consider their respective obligations with regard to human rights and the rights of Indigenous Peoples, consistent with the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples

Explicitly state how their implementation considers Indigenous Peoples' land and water rights and respects Indigenous governance systems (incl. Territorial Rights and Governance)

Promote processes of co-production of knowledge through respectful, ethical, and equitable collaboration and partnership with Indigenous Peoples and their knowledge holders, including free, prior, and informed consent.

Ensure that Indigenous Peoples are equal partners in all phases of the NDCs, including their preparation, implementation, monitoring and verification.

Dive deeper into the underlying factors that have caused this problem, including the ongoing, structural legacy of colonialism and capitalism, including proposed measures.
